

## Conditions of participation: on-campus and/or face-to-face campaigning

As part of our approach to on-campus and face-to-face campaigning we require all campaign workers to confirm that:

You are not showing any symptoms of COVID-19;

You have not had contact with a person who has been confirmed with COVID-19 in the past 14 days;

You have not returned from overseas, Victoria, or any other location the subject of a NSW Public Health Order in the past 14 days;

You have not been tested for COVID-19 and are awaiting results;

You will follow any relevant COVID-19 Safety Plan requirements advised to you and any reasonable directions of the Electoral Officer, SRC WHS officer, University Protective Services (security staff) and/or emergency services personnel.

If you cannot meet these conditions, you must not attend campus and/or participate in face-to-face campaigning activities.

Item	Permitted
Speak face to face	Only permitted if recipient wishes to communicate If minimum 1.5metre social distancing maintained Indoors only if maximum group number of ten (10) persons and social distancing maintained Outdoors only if maximum group number of twenty (20) persons and social distancing maintained
Entering a teaching space and speaking to one or more students	In accordance with relevant University regulations Not permitted while a class is in progress.
Chalking	In accordance with SRC Regulations & relevant University regulations. Each chalker is to be provided with their own unique piece of chalk. Chalk is not be shared.
Posting	In accordance with SRC Regulations & relevant University regulations. Each posterer is to be provided with their own tape dispenser. Sanitising measures to be undertaken before and after handling of the tape dispenser by different people.
A Frames (Sandwich Boards)	In accordance with SRC Regulations & relevant University regulations. Sanitising measures to be undertaken before and after each handling by different people.
Walking Sandwich Boards (person walking with boards)	If minimum 1.5metre social distancing maintained, and in accordance with SRC Regulations and University regulations. Sanitising measures to be undertaken before and after each use by different people.
Person walking and or holding a sign either on a pole or in their hands	If minimum 1.5metre social distancing maintained, and in accordance with SRC Regulations and University regulations. Sanitising measures (use of disinfectant wipes) to be undertaken before and after each use by different people.
Standing on a "soapbox" i.e. pedestal etc	At least one campaign worker assigned responsibility to monitor physical distancing (1.5m separation) and maximum numbers in a group, and prompt corrective action (e.g. instruction to group and/or cease activity) where required.
Using a megaphone or portable public address system	In accordance with SRC Regulations and University Regulations. Sanitising measures (using disinfectant wipes) to be undertaken before and after each use by different by different people.
Handing out election material	It is preferred that you do not hand out any election material and that all election material is distributed virtually (such as through QR codes ) You are only permitted to hand out election material to voters who have requested receiving it.
"Walk The Line" otherwise known as the pedestrian route from Redfern Station to the University	Not permitted

In person campaigning is for the period 00:01 am AEST Monday 21st September 2020 and ends 6:00 pm AEST Thursday 1st October 2020.

University Protective Services primary role is to ensure a safe campus, and will be enforcing necessary measures to ensure a safe COVID-19 environment.

It is important to realise that your actions in persuading votes could be counter productive (especially with regard to entering a teaching space and delaying a lecture). Some voters might decide that based upon your campaigning including that of how you demonstrated your lack of COVID-19 prevention measures, that they might vote for someone else. PLEASE RESPECT THEIR WISHES if they do not wish to either communicate with you and or receive election material.
